

The estate has origins dating back to the 17th century and still preserves its historical heritage of "Palazzo" built by the bishop of Montalcino. In 1877 the Ciacci family acquired the entire property. Following the marriage between Count Alberto Piccolomini d'Aragona, direct descendant of Enea Silvio Piccolomini [better known as Pope Pius II] and Elda Ciacci, the Episcopal Palace became the Ciacci Piccolomini d'Aragona Palace.

In 1985, Countess Elda Ciacci bequeathed the entire property to Giuseppe Bianchini, the estate's farmer, applying a completely new and avant-garde production philosophy for the time, increasing the quantity and quality of the wines and opening exports to the entire world. Currently his children Paolo, Lucia, Alex and Ester Bianchini run the winery, with...
