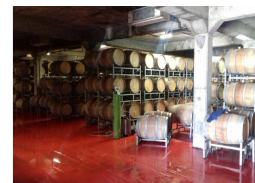
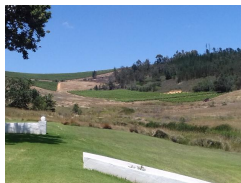




Man Family Wines is a South African producer characterized by producing modern-style varietal wines. The firm was founded in 2002 by winemakers José Conde (of Stark-Condé Wines) and brothers Tyrrel and Philip Myburgh (of Joostenberg Wines). Together they decided to name the new winery MAN, the result of the initials of their wives: Marie, Anette and Nicky. The MAN brand started with just 600 cases of Pinotage made in a modest tractor shed, but today they produce more than 250,000 cases and exports to more than 30 countries.

The company is committed to the sustainable vineyard management: Both José Conde and Tyrrel Myburgh have extensive experience in craft production, having decided to apply their approach to MAN on a larger scale. The grapes used to make their wines are grown...



Properties: The grapes used to for MAN's wines are sourced from 26 winegrower partners located in the Perdeberg area of Agter-Paarl. The winery also owns the Lievland Estate, which has 105 has. in the rolling hills of Simonsberg Stellenbosch. It is presently under re-conversion.

Production: 1,500,000 bottles per year of which 80% is exported
