

Its sunlight hours are longer than in any other region of New Zealand. Combined with its silty alluvial soils, this makes Marlborough an ideal place for cool-climate viticulture. The sun shines for an average of 2,500 hours per year, and even on the hottest days, nighttime temperatures drop significantly, allowing for excellent ripening and fresh, vibrant acidity.



Mount Riley's most iconic vineyard is 17 Valley, predominantly planted with Pinot Noir. It is the furthest from the Richmond Ranges and receives the least rainfall. That, combined with its clay-based soils (and stunning views of the Pacific Ocean), makes it a perfect site for grape growing.

The 'Anderson Block' is located in central Wairau and serves as the operations hub. Its upper terrace has deep clay deposits,...
