In very broad terms, the appellation is divided into three zones which follow river valleys, with those wines from the village of Serralunga in the southeast being the most powerful, long-lived & full-bodied. Besides the obvious quality of their wines, this producer also provides Mundidrinks with a more complete vision of the Barolo appllation.
