



The Palatinate (called Pfalz in German) is an extension of the vineyards of Alsace, west of the Rhine river, and one of the largest winegrowing districts in the country. Its rolling, vineyard –covered hills enjoy a cliamte protected by the Haart mountains, the same range that in France is called Voges.

The best part of the Palatinate is the central district of Mittelhaart, surrounding the towns of Forst, Deidesheim and Ruppertsberg, where one finds some of the mosr famous estates in Germany. This is where Reichstrat von Buhl is located, a historic winery dating back to 1849, and famous during the 19th century for producing some of the most prestigious wines of the time. Von Buhl wines have been selected to celebrate many different occasions, such as the official inauguration of...



Properties: 62 hectares of vineyards of mostly Riesling (88%)distributed between the villages of Forst, Ruppertsberg and Deidesheim. All are organically farmed.

Production: 420.000 bottles per year.
